



PAAKOUA: Cool or Dangerous?

Parkour or "<u>free</u> running," is like an obstacle race. You get from point A to point B using your arms and legs. Parkour includes running, climbing and jumping. A person who <u>practices</u> parkour is a <u>traceur</u> (boy or man) or <u>traceuse</u> (girl or woman). Parkour is <u>originally</u> from France.

Some people don't want parkour in <u>public</u> areas. They say that parkour is too dangerous for kids. Obviously, traceurs need to <u>train</u> with a parkour group to learn all the techniques. Kids in big cities like the excitement of parkour, because it is spectacular. But they need to be very careful, because parkour can be dangerous!
